Upcoming PCS Season

As a friendly reminder, if you anticipate orders or are PCSing this summer, please know that our office, Henderson Hall Marine Corps Base EFMP, does not have visibility of your orders. The assignment screening process takes place at HQMC EFMP, located at Marine Corps Base Quantico. It is imperative that your EFMP paperwork be up-to-date ahead of receiving your orders. This ensures that HQMC EFMP Assignment Case Managers are not waiting on your updated **DD Form 2792** and/or **DD Form 2792-1** in order to screen your orders in a timely manner. Updated EFMP paperwork also ensures accurate screening of your enrolled family member's needs.

Not sure when, or if, you are due to update your EFMP paperwork? Need to update right away? Please do not hesitate to contact your Henderson Hall EFMP Family Case Worker. *Amy Proce (703) 693-6510 or Davina Hardaway (703) 693-4172 are standing by and are more than happy to assist you with the EFMP enrollment update process.*

HQMC EFMP Assignment Case Managers are working diligently on screening orders as quickly as possible. They screen them in order based upon the earliest departure date (EDD) or not-earlier-than date (NET). Please be patient, as they may have hundreds of orders in their queue to screen at any given time.

If you have a pressing issue that requires the screening of your orders to be expedited, you must contact your monitor to voice your concern. If your monitor deems expedited screening necessary, they can reach out to HQMC EFMP to request an expedited review on your behalf.

Concerned you won't be able to apply for base housing in a timely manner without your orders? We may have an option for you. Please call your Henderson Hall EFMP Family Case Worker and inquire about the **Advanced Application for Housing Letter**. This option is only for housing on other Marine Corps installations.

The needs of your family are very important to us. We are always ready and willing to support you. Thank you.

Autism At A Glance

Some facts about autism

- * The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) estimates autism's prevalence as 1 in 44 children in the United States.
- * An estimated 50,000 teens with autism become adults. When they become adults they no longer qualify for lose school-based autism services.
- * Approximately one third of people with autism are nonverbal.
- * Approximately 1/3 of people with autism have an intellectual disability.
- * For the majority of people, autism is lifelong.
- * Wandering impacts nearly 1/2 of all children with Autism.

If you have a student or if you are a student who needs extra help in school tutor.com offers **free** online tutoring services to military affiliated students of all ages and abilities. Tutors are available 24 hours a day 7 days a week. The service is available on demand so no appointments are necessary. As long as a student had internet connection available they are able to use the service. If a student would like to have an ongoing appointment for tutoring that is also available. 
SUMMER 2022

Military-connected children from all uniformed service branches are eligible to apply for a **free** camp through **Operation Purple**. While campers are not guaranteed a spot, the Operation Purple Camp website states that, "campers are prioritized based on several criteria that include, but are not limited to, being the child of a service member that is wounded, ill, or injured or having a parent or guardian currently in a deployment cycle (has deployed, preparing to deploy, currently deployed). Priority is given to children who have never attended Operation Purple Camp to guarantee as many children as possible get to experience the joys of camping." 
Henderson Hall EFMP Lending Library and Loan Locker




