
SPECIAL NEEDS FORUM RECAP

MAGIC MILK EXPERIMENT

Materials

- Almond Milk or Cow's Milk
- Dish soap
- Q-tips (Cotton Swab)
- Cotton Balls
- Food coloring
- Shallow plate or wide bowls
- 1. Fill a plate or bowl with milk.
- 2. Drop in at least 2 drops of each of four colors of food coloring. The more variety of colors the cooler the painting.
- 3. Generously dip the end of a q-tip in dish soap.
- 4. Now dip the q-tip (cotton swab) into the milk next to a drop of color.
- 5. The first thing that will happen is the color will burst as soon as the dish soap hits it. It's a great effect but very short lived. Once there is a little dishsoap in the milk it no longer "bursts".
- 6.Gently swirl the q-tip through the different colors and you'll see little rivers of color start to form.Continue until the colors begin to mix and become brown. Empty your plate/bowl and repeat
