The Organization for Autism Research offers a free, digital library of autism-related ebooks and audiobooks. Community members may enjoy both fiction and nonfiction, including children's books and guidebooks. To access the library, create a free account with OAR, download the LIBBY_app on your phone or device and search for "Organization for Autism Research." Consider selecting a book or two to read during Autism Acceptance Month.

Autism Society of Northern Virginia

Autism Society of Northern Virginia (ASNV) builds community for individuals and families through education, advocacy, and support. ASNV works to educate members of the community about autism by offering workshops, trainings, online resource directory, and information and referrals. ASNV encourages advocacy to create lasting changes. ASNV provides direct support to families by offering an intervention assistance fund; support groups for autistic adults, parents and caregivers of adults on the spectrum, parents of autistic teens, and middle age adults on the spectrum; assistive technology; family social events; and a peer mentor program. While parenting may not come with a manual, there are plenty of resources to learn methods for raising healthy, resilient children. One such resource is Thrive online training, a partnership between the DOD and the Military Family Clearinghouse at Penn State. Thrive training is completely free for military families and focuses on supporting positive parent practices, parent/child stress management and strategies to promote physical health. Evidence-informed trainings include modules to support parents of children ages 0-3, 3-5, 5-10 and 10-16. "Mini-booster modules" are also available to refresh skills in 2-3 minutes. Additional 2 hour supplemental modules include topics like neurodiversity/autism, raising a child with special needs, anger management and adolescent mental health.

Thrive also features downloadable resources like a family media plan and mindfulness techniques. The regular blog can also add more tips and tricks to the parenting toolbox. Learn more and register online at the Thrive website.

Sensory Friendly Activities across the NCR

LEGO Discovery Center Sensory-Friendly Mornings

\$25.99 per person. You may be eligible for one free ADA caregiver ticket. Enjoy the LEGO center from 1000-1100 with reduced lighting and music. This event is held the first Wednesday of every month. For all ages. <u>Link</u>.

Accessible Adult Fans of LEGO Nights

\$24.99 per person. Ages 18+ only. Enjoy the LEGO center from 1800-2000 with reduced lighting and music. This event is held the Wednesday of every month. For adults with special needs or sensory differences.

Sensory Sundays at the B & O Rail Museum

\$20/adult, \$12/child. AD is free. First Sundays in select months. Environmental accommodations (no music, low lighting, quiet areas, increased signage for areas with sound effects), sensory-friendly events (kids craft, train ride, and tour) and resources (sensory kits, social stories, and community table) will be available. Morning at the Museum

Free. Dates and Smithsonian museum vary. Registration required. Sensory-friendly program for children, teens, and young adults who are neurodivergent and their families. Participants enter the museum early and explore at their own pace. <u>Link</u>

Alamo Drafthouse Cinema

Alamo for All program is active in both Northern VA and DC. All shows on Tuesday before 2:00 p.m. are sensory-friendly. Additional shows are available on weekends.

AMC Theatres

Second and fourth Saturdays for family-friendly movies and Wednesday evenings of every month offer sensory-friendly showings

Children's Museum of Virginia

Portsmouth, VA. Reduced number of visitors and adapted programs/exhibits.

Note: Second floor currently under construction. Held the second Sunday of every month. Link.

Kennedy Center

Price varies. Lower lighting during entire performance, reduced sounds, and designated quiet area of theater. Guests are welcome to talk and move throughout performances. Website includes scripted stories to talk about an upcoming visit. Link.


Regal Movies
